ATTENDANCE AND PLAYING STATISTICS

As set out in the Information Guide on our Society website it's expected of members that they participate in at least 50% of the matches arranged by the Society in any given year. Reasonable levels of attendance at our games are important as it's becoming more difficult to negotiate time allocations and discounts on green fees at clubs. One of the positives that we can offer is that we can bring a lot of players each time we play. The greater our numbers, the better we're able negotiate.

We're now almost half way through 2023 and average attendance for the 10 games played so far this year is only 49% once allowance is made for leave and sick leave.

Drilling deeper into the data we find the following for our 78 members:

- 40 have played 5 or more games
- 18 have played 4 games
- 7 have played 3 games
- 6 have played 2 games
- 6 have played one game
- 3 have not played any games.

Points to note

It is a concern to the committee that for the year to date, on average, more than a quarter of our members don't respond to game notices with an apology or reason for their absence. Please guys, it's not too much to expect that you respond to game notices timeously so that Petra is aware of who is or isn't available.

Please let us know and ask for leave of absence if you're going to be travelling or have to have a medical procedure that's going to prevent you playing for more than one game.

THREE BALL ARRANGEMENTS

There's often confusion at games where members play in a three ball. Please make note of our policy in that regard.

PIVOT PLAYER - ALL FORMATS

In the event that members play in a three ball, for whatever reason, the Captain will – after the match, randomly select a "ghost" player from the field who will then complete the four-ball.

Three-balls must fill in the score and points for each player, for each hole, but leave the 4th Player's data blank. There scorer will complete the card.
