2017 Committee

HERE'S HOW THE ECLECTIC COMPETITION WORKS

The third Eclectic has just drawn to a close, with many of our members still a little vague on exactly what it is and how it works. The dictionary tells us that "eclectic is choosing, or picking the best."

That is what we do with our golf scores, we pick the best stableford points scored, on each hole, at all the nominated courses for every golfer throughout the year (our year is from just after our championships, until just before the next one, so November to September.)

In the first year we scored "The Eclectic" on net scores, but it was very onerous to capture the scores accurately, so it was decided to change to the best stableford score as from year two. Every player's stableford score, at each course which we play (only one round at each course), and on each hole, is recorded.

This gives the players an opportunity to better their scores regularly, because for example, the first hole at Irene is stroke 15, but at PCC it is stroke 2. This does not matter, because it is the points that count.

So, a player may achieve 18 two-pointers in round one, giving a score of 36. In round two, he plays really badly, but chips in twice to make 2 four-pointers, and little else. His Eclectic score however, improves by 4 points. Each time he scores more than the points already achieved on any given hole, his score improves.

History shows us that the frontrunners in the Eclectic, generally make three-pointers on most holes, and the winners are those who make the most four-pointers or, as was the case last year, two players recorded a five-pointer each.
